Dear Friends.

In the gospel of last Sunday, Jesus identified himself as a Good Shepherd who loves and cares for his sheep even to the point of laying down his life for the sheep. It is a parable he used to explain the relationship between him and the Church. In today's gospel, he uses the parable of the vine and its branches to explain the unity between him and the believers. Like the sheep which is defenceless without the shepherd, so it is



between Christ and us. In order to understand this parable clearly, we need to know the importance of the grapevine in the life of Jewish society. The grapevine was very symbolic in Ancient Israel. It was a prized possession in the ancient Middle East, much care was taken when planting and maintaining the vine. The image of a Vineyard runs through the Old Testament to describe God's special relationship with Israel, how he carefully chose them, cared for them, provided for them in their time of need and protected them in times of danger. Israel was described as the Lord's choicest vine planted in his vineyard expecting to produce good grapes. For each branch to bear fruit, it must be firmly grafted to the vine. Jesus used the connection between the vine and its branches to describe the relationship between him and us. He is the true Vine and we are the branches.

Today Jesus is telling us that we are part of him and we belong to him. We drive existence, joy and happiness from him. Being part of Him and derive graces from him, we are expected to bear good fruit in return. Bearing good fruit is a compliment of gratitude to Him and to God almighty. St. Paul bore good fruit after he encountered Jesus on his way to Damascus. He not only accepted Jesus in his life, but he also became a strong instrument of evangelization. Paul grafted himself strongly onto the true Vine Jesus Christ. He bore abundant and lasting fruit through his good works in the gentile

nations. Its no wonder he exclaimed that when anyone is in Christ Jesus, that one is a new creation... (2nd Cor. 5:17). That one is a new creation by keeping God's commandment. Today, the Church invites us to reflect on our spiritual progress. How is my relationship with Christ going? Am I still believing and living in Him? Am I bearing any good fruit as a Christian? Bearing good fruit involves spiritual growth and positive impact on others. We cannot be in Christ for years and suffer from spiritual lethargy, because a stagnant water is not worth drinking. There has to be progress in our relationship with Christ, this progress must be expressed in our trust in him, in our better knowledge of him, and in our love for him and for others. In doing so we become branches of the true Vine, Jesus Christ.
